NEWS FROM NEXUS TRIOS



One of the Twin Trio groups of the NEXUS project, which includes Technological University Dublin (Ireland), Koç University (Turkey), and Sofia University (Bulgaria) are developing the following key actions:

•GBV Training and Awareness Module - we have established the topic of the module - "Bystander intervention awareness training" This training is focused on educating staff, students, and the wider university community on the prevention of GBV. The training will promote understanding of the social and psychological impacts of GBV, develop skills for identifying and responding to violence, and encourage a culture of zero tolerance. The aim is to create a safer, more supportive environment for everyone.

•Inclusive Mentoring and Career Progression – a Needs Analysis (conducting a surveys and interviews) The universities will conduct a needs analysis survey and interviews among students to identify barriers to career advancement and inclusion. This analysis will inform the design of mentoring programs that address specific challenges related to gender inequality. It aims to offer personalized guidance and support, enhancing the academic and professional growth in the university.

•Inclusive Mentoring for Career Progression and Success (Improvement and expansion of the Mentoring Programs and establishing one) - Building on the findings from the needs analysis, the existing mentoring programs will be expanded and improved. The goal is to provide tailored support for career progression, with an emphasis on inclusivity. This includes creating opportunities for all students. It ensures that mentoring is a tool for breaking down barriers and promoting long-term success across all disciplines. Guidelines will be created.






New Release: The NEXUS Toolkit
